 - B. No-Wake Zone Blue Star Bridge to I-196 Bridge – No movement has been made with this agenda item. The Township was brought up to speed on the topic and all that is involved.

- C. Role of the Kalamazoo Lake Harbor Authority & How It May Impact the Douglas Harbor Authority – Both DHA and KLHA felt it was appropriate to keep the two boards separate and that having overlapping members is a benefit.

A. Committee Reports:

- i – Harbor Safety Sub-Committee: VanLoon stated that this committee is no longer, and it can be removed from the agenda moving forward.

Point Pleasant has seen many updates, Union St. and Schultz Park boat launch fees have increased, rowing docks at Wades Bayou will be installed soon, invasive treatments in the Douglas Harbor is scheduled for June and July, and the role of the DHA was also discussed.

- iii – Township Manager, DeFranco was thankful for accommodating the Township with the transition. Buoys for the Township areas of the waterways will be out soon also. The Township will also look into invasive treatments for the few associations interested.

SAFETY POINTS FOR HUMAN POWERED CRAFTS (HPC) /NON-MOTORIZED CRAFTS

- Stay Alert - Five short blasts from a horn/whistle is a danger signal.
- Upstream provides the best natural areas to explore.
- For Human Power Crafts (HPC) ONLY - When downstream to the Saugatuck Harbor, stay between the red buoys and the shore.
- Keep a Personal Flotation Device (PFD) with you at all times.
- Watch the WEATHER; it can change quickly.
- Dial 911 if in trouble and be prepared to provide a point of reference for your location.
