REMINDER-Trash Receptacles Placement and Storage: Please remember to follow the guidelines under city ordinance number *54.07 RECEPTACLES*, as it relates to the set-out, and storage of trash containers. The City has received numerous complaints about trash cans being left out beyond the times cited in the ordinance and will address any violations accordingly.

**All portable receptacles shall be stored upon the premises and shall not be set out for collection prior to 12:00 p.m. proceeding the day of collection, and after the receptacles are emptied, they shall be returned to their place of storage on the same day collections are made. No empty portable receptacles shall be stored on city property, including the public right-of-way, sidewalks, and streets. **

Pedestrian Crosswalks: Please be mindful that yielding to pedestrians in designated (and marked) crosswalks is the law. We want to ensure everyone's safety. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Nominating Petitions: Nominating Petitions are now available for the office of Douglas City Council for the November 5, 2024, General Election. Four (4) non-partisan positions will be filled for terms of two-years each. Candidates must be a U.S. Citizen, registered elector in the City and shall have been a resident of the City for not less than twelve (12) months. (per Sect. 3.3 of

the City Charter). Petitions can be obtained from the City Clerk's Office. The filing deadline is July 23, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. Please contact the City Clerk for more information.
